Marian State School is a strict uniform school. We have the support of our Parents and Citizens' Association, School Staff and School Management Committee to promote 100% adherence to the uniform. Our student dress code consists of an agreed standard and items of clothing, which includes a school uniform that Marian State School students wear when:

- Attending or representing their school;
- Travelling to and from school; and
- Engaging in school activities out of school hours.

Marian State School Parents and Citizens' Association supports a student dress code policy because it believes that a student dress code provides clothing that aims to contribute to a safe and supportive teaching and learning environment through:

- Ready identification of students and non-students at school;
- Fostering a sense of belonging; and
- Developing mutual respect among students by minimising visible evidence of economic or social differences.
- Promotes an effective teaching and learning environment by eliminating the distraction of competition in dress and fashion at the school.

Marian's student dress code reflects school community standards and are consistent with occupational health and safety and antidiscrimination legislation.

We will actively encourage our students to take pride in themselves and their school. One way in which this may be achieved is through adherence to the school's dress standards. As the parent/carer and provider of your child, we seek your support in this matter.

Inappropriate dress refers to clothing or apparel worn by students that is deemed to be:

- Offensive:
- Likely to disrupt, or negatively influence normal school operations;
- Unsafe for student or others; and
- Likely to result in a risk to health and safety of student or others.
- Changes physical appearance.

In circumstances where inappropriate or unreasonable dress is worn, appropriate action will be taken.
